This section will expand and if additional space is required, organization may add no more than 1 additional sheet. Funding is requested to support the After School Challenge Program (ASCP). ASCP provides children with educational activities and experiences that promote optimal growth and development. YWCA's ASCP serves a total of 750 students attending 7 San Antonio public schools. YWCA contracts with East Central ISD to provide services at four schools – Highland Forest Elementary, Pecan Valley Elementary, Sinclair Elementary and Salado Intermediate. YWCA contracts with South San ISD to provide services at three elementary schools – Armstrong, Carrillo and Price. Students receive a nutritious snack, homework assistance, tutoring and other school-related assistance in a program that is designed to be an extension of the educational school day.
All parents are invited to enroll their children in the after-school program offered at their child's school. However, the YWCA's program is limited to 750 children due to space and staffing requirements. Children are accepted for ASCP on a first-come first-served basis. Families pay a sliding scale fee for the after-school program based on their household income and household size. These fees are paid to the City of San Antonio which administers the program. The YWCA contracts with the City to operate the program and is paid a flat fee. Unfortunately, the fee is not sufficient to pay for materials and supplies needed to operate a successful academic program. As a result the YWCA relies on fundraising events and donations to make up the difference.
The three elementary schools served in East Central enroll students in kindergarten through 3rd grade. Salado Intermediate in the East Central ISD enrolls children in 4th and 5th grade. A total of 2,521 students attend these four schools. Last year students attending these schools were 9.6% Black, 80.8% Hispanic and 7.2% White. 73.6% were economically disadvantaged and 13.4% were English language learners.
The three schools served in South San ISD enroll students in Pre-K through 5th grade. The three schools enrolled a total of 1,331 students last year. Students were 98% Hispanic and 95% economically disadvantaged. The schools had a total of 326 English Language Learners or 24.5% of the students.
