There were no changes in the objective of eliminating the mental health waitlist.

4: What needs were addressed?

The GCCAC offers fee-free, specialized, trauma-informed counseling services to clients. These crucial services facilitate healing and reduce the risk of additional victimization through psycho-education, empowerment and fostering healthy coping skills. Through this project, the GCCAC was able to provide counseling services to numerous families and significantly decrease the mental health waitlist.

5: What method of evaluation did you use to monitor and measure the project's outcome and what are the result?

In order to evaluate the project, we examine weekly the number of clients on the mental health waitlist, as well as the duration of time clients remain on the waitlist. Before the project began, there were approximately 95 families on the mental health waitlist and the duration of wait time was sometimes over 6 months. Since hiring the Najim Charitable Foundation funded position, the waitlist and time spent by clients on the list have continuously decreased until the recent turnover. Although there were other factors that contributed to this outcome, the ability to hire an additional therapist was vital.

In addition to the weekly review of the mental health waitlist, the clinical director also implemented a supervision process with each therapist that allowed for more focused therapeutic processes for children in services. Each week, the clinical director and therapist discussed the therapeutic goals of each client and their progress toward meeting those goals in order to ensure that clients were benefiting from therapy as well as being discharged in a timely manner upon completion of the therapeutic goals.

6: Do you plan to continue this project, and if so, how do you plan to sustain it?

The GCCAC plans to continue this project and minimize the number of families on the mental health waitlist, and plans to sustain this project by seeking grants from the Najim Charitable Foundation and/or other foundations in future years. The additional therapist added to the GCCAC staff was vital to reducing the therapy waitlist, so it is important that the GCCAC continues to acquire the funds to retain this position.

Due to the recent vacancy in a therapy position, it became apparent that the current number of therapists at the GCCAC is necessary to ensure that the waitlist does not grow to an unreasonable waiting period for children who need these specialized services.

7: Please provide any other comments ot information relevant to this grant.

The GCCAC is grateful for the opportunity to have this therapist on staff because of funding from the Najim Charitable Foundation. Since the recent resignation of our most tenured therapist, the waitlist has increased from 9 to 42 families. This shows just how important it is to keep four full-time therapists on staff. Without funding for this therapist position, there would be even more families still on the mental health waitlist. With limited other counseling resources in the area, the GCCAC strives to not only minimize but eventually eliminate the mental health waitlist. The therapist position funded in part by the Najim Charitable Foundation is necessary for the goal of completely eliminating the waitlist.
