Program / Project Description:

Wish Granting

The allure of a wish experience is not only a source of inspiration for children undergoing arduous medical treatments, but also a positive force that helps them overcome their obstacles, bringing hope to them and their family, at a time needed most. The wish child's family is involved in the entire wish process giving everyone a respite from the challenges of having a family member with a critical medical condition. Therefore, more than 12,000 family members have been able to experience the hope and healing power of a wish.

Each wish begins when a child, between the ages 2 1/2 and before the 18th birthday, is referred to Make-A-Wish by a medical professional or parent. Once referred and deemed eligible, two wish granting volunteers are assigned to make a visit to the child's home to find out the child's one true heartfelt wish by asking," If you had one wish, what would it be?" Wishes are often limited only by the child's imagination, but usually fit into one of the following four categories: I wish to be: a police officer, an astronaut, a ballerina; I wish to have: a computer, a shopping spree, a room redo; I wish to go: on a cruise, to the Bahamas, to Disney World; or I wish to meet: a famous athlete, a famous author or a famous actor.

Once a wish is determined, our Program team engages donors and community resources to come together and make possible a magical and unforgettable experience. An individualized plan is developed and a budget is made. Through our Adopt-A-Wish program, regardless of the cost of a wish, a grant of \$5,000 will adopt the wish of a medically eligible child.

Our services have been identified as a tool for delivery of best medical services possible to young children, as well as an avenue to promote family healing. Parents and medical professionals report that the services provided by Make-A-Wish make a difference in the child's health care delivery, attitude, receptiveness, outlook and overall disposition. When a child receives a wish, he or she experiences excitement, anticipation, comfort and joy. A wish experience is often more than a dream come true, it is the catalyst that rekindles the child's belief in themselves and the promise of their future. Over 70% of our wish children survive their challenges and their tragedy becomes a source of strength.

Based on the Wish Impact Study conducted by Make-A-Wish America, it was determined that wish experiences benefit children's physical health and everyone's state of mind, as well as positively impacting the community.

According to the study:

89% of parents observed an increase in their child's emotional strength

75% of parents observed that the wish experience increased their child's physical health

84% of parents observed a decrease in their child's anxieties and fears

91% of parents observed that the wish experience decreased their child's depression or sadness

98% of parents felt that the wish experience gave them the opportunity to be a normal family again.

The wish granting program provides a child hope, strength and joy throughout the entire wish experience. the wish experience is invaluable to the healing of a child with a critical medical condition. Research shows that when you grant a wish you do more than bring joy to a critically ill children, you also give them an edge in conquering their illness. *

Last year we granted 283 wishes, the most in our chapter's history, and we are on pace to grant over 300 wishes this year. With an unprecedented rise in referrals of critically ill children and hundreds of children in our pipeline, the support of the Najim Foundation by adopting 10 wishes would play an integral role in helping us in our goal to serve every medically eligible child in San Antonio.

Our goal is to deliver the highest quality wishes possible. To evaluate and measure our performance, and to continually strive to improve our services, we encourage each of our wish families served to complete a Wish Satisfaction Survey upon the conclusion of their child's wish. The results of those surveys are used to provide feedback for us to strengthen our services in support of our mission.

Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

We will continue to reach out to individuals, corporations, civic organizations, and foundations for support. Moreover, we have support from our national partners such as: Macy's, Maggiano's, Bio Trust, Top Golf, Brooks Brothers and many others. We have a Kids For Wish Kids program that is a fundraising program implemented by schools. We have numerous external events, and four signature internal events: Walk For Wishes/World Wish Day, Wishes and Dishes, Over the Edge, and the Laredo Radiothon. Our chapter was established in 1984, and we have been granted wishes since then to impact the health and wellness of critically ill children. We are proud to have never denied a wish to a medically qualified child.
