Program / Project Description:

Need the project will address: ABC addresses emergency and critical needs of families to appropriately care for their child/youth with a disability or special health care need.

Grant Request: ABC respectfully request funds to support operations, including partial funding for program staff (case manager and prescription assistance advocate) and Patty's Angel Fund, a direct financial assistance fund that helps children access much-needed items such as prescription medication, medical equipment, and many other critical items.

Program/Project:

Patty's Angel Fund is a critical component of ABC's safety net services developed to address the vital needs of families raising a child with a serious disability or special health care need: tangible/direct assistance, known as Patty's Angel Fund. Every family enrolled in ABC services has access to Patty's Angel Fund through the help of their case manager or advocate. Funds assist with prescription medication, durable medical equipment and supplies, specialized formula and nutritional supplies (not available through food pantries), basic household needs, home safety equipment, funeral assistance, and other items identified through the client and family's assessment and goals. ABC strives to ensure that families have the help they need to remain stable and alleviate stressors. ABC continues to address the dire needs of the community.

ABC has experienced a 291% increase in requests for medical equipment for children with special health care needs. ABC was able to pivot and expanded services through the Prescription Assistance Program (PAP), which helps children access prescription medications. Many families are without the resources to afford cranial helmets seen as cosmetic by insurance companies and Medicare. The cost of a cranial helmet is from \$1,800 up to \$3,000 depending on the measurements and child's needs. At this time, there was no agency in the community helping families in accessing medical equipment. Other nonprofits like Project MEND provides medical equipment only when in stock from donations, and if not available, families force to figure out solutions. Many families are left helpless utilizing predatory lending practices such as payday lenders. PAP Advocates help families by guiding them through the process to receive a cranial helmet. This includes working with the medical equipment provider and the child's physician. ABC staff help families fill out the necessary paperwork and communicate with the child's physician to get the proper documentation to ensure the child receives the much-needed cranial helmet. PAP Advocates access Patty's Angel Fund to purchase medical equipment like cranial helmets, medication, or other critical items for the child with a special health care need.

Additionally, ABC experienced a 47% increase in funeral assistance from families facing the loss of their child or youth. Through ABC's Center for Infant and Child Loss, we help families who have experienced the tragic loss of their child by helping them with financial assistance through Patty's Angel Fund to provide a meaningful and dignified farewell. ABC is the only agency in the community that provides bereavement support to parents that have experienced the loss of a child. Additionally, services include grief literature and counseling support, funeral assistance, and an annual memorial service.

ABC programs guide, support, educate, and empower parents to adapt and navigate the various stages of their child's medical journey. ABC offers the only comprehensive case management program of its kind, working with families to navigate the health and human services systems. Families create person-centered goals, attain resources, and access a full array of educational and support services, including housing and employment assistance. Case managers ensure families get the support they need to access medical care and community resources to prevent poor outcomes, including abuse and neglect, of a vulnerable population of children. This program helps families leave the cycle of crisis and enter a position of stability to take care of the whole family. In FY20, ABC completed 6,180 home visits and made over 3,068 community referrals to ensure that all needs were addressed.

Individuals impacted: The need to assist families following the birth or diagnosis of their child with a special health care need has not abated in our community. ABC serves families raising children with special health care needs in Bexar County, and families represent every social, economic, and educational level. Though a child with disabilities can be born into any family, most families utilizing services are those with few resources; 58% of families lived at or below 100% of the poverty level.

Goal: The goal is to stabilize the family so that parents can provide appropriate care and a safe environment for their child with a disability. ABC services improve the quality of life for the entire family, especially the child.

Expected results: As a result of ABC programs, families who participate are found to be more knowledgeable about their child's condition, feel more competent to manage parenting challenges, and experience decreased family stress. Parents are better able to make decisions and advocate for their children after completing ABC programs. Families improve their coping skills, are better able to move on to face future challenges, and are better able to adapt to changed circumstances. Family stress decreases as parents increase their overall feelings of competency. As family stress decreases, family stability is restored, preventing family break-up and ensuring that families will provide appropriate and nurturing care to their children, and both the child and family will grow and develop to the best of their ability.

Evaluation Plan:

ABC program data is entered, tracked, and maintained in ClientTrack, a dedicated database. Families access Patty's Angel Fund through all ABC programs, and Patty's Angel Fund expenditures are tracked by program and accounting staff. Surveys are conducted at intake, and once the case becomes inactive to determine the change in knowledge of the child's condition, knowledge of and ability to access community resources, enrollment in a medical home, in parental feelings of competency to meet family needs and of satisfaction with agency services. Evaluation results are compiled, analyzed, and reviewed by the Program Director and shared with the leadership team.

Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

ABC leadership is working will strengthen the organization's financial sustainability. In conjunction with the development team, the leadership is actively working on improving the agency's financial sustainability through a Strategic Development Plan. The plan includes re-engaging individual donors, corporate donors and revamping agency events to maximize impact for the families we serve. Funding can be targeted to specific programs that are challenging to sustain or need funding year-round. Regarding grants, ABC diligently seeks out available resources to maintain the agency's unique programs provided at no cost to families and are not available anywhere else, without any barriers to entry.
