Program / Project Description:

Catch the Next, Inc. (CTN), established in 2009, is a national, award-winning college readiness and completion organization committed to increasing equitable outcomes in higher education. Funds are being requested to increase enrollment and student engagement for the Ascender program, professional development, campus coaching, internships and transformative teaching. Ascender is a first year experience program for community college students created to ensure college readiness toward completion and transfer. It combines: Navigational support through holistic advising, counseling, and a Learning Framework course, An academic pathway that features a year-long sequence of English and additional core subjects by instructors trained in the model, A Student Engagement component that includes community mentorship, cultural events, leadership development and internships. The Transformative Teaching Track TTT is a two-day, experiential and intensive training in classroom strategies, co-curricular design and team-building with an emphasis on culturally responsive practice. Our training is tailored to meet the needs of faculty who wish to play a leadership role in response to House Bill 2223 and the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board's 60 x 30 Campaign

Evaluation Plan:

Measuring the Catch the Next Program

Currently, program facilitators administer both a pretest and a posttest to Ascender program participants in order to measure what information is learned by the students during the program. At the conclusion of each session, we also ask participating faculty/ teachers to complete a detailed evaluation questionnaire so we can continue to find ways to improve an already excellent program.

Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

In the past year, Catch the Next has approached several new grant makers for support, and we are pleased to report that Catch the Next has received grants from the Meadows Foundation and Invest in Us Foundation.

With support from the Meadows Foundation, Catch the Next was able to hire a fundraising consultant who is working with our board of directors to develop and implement a strategic fundraising plan that will incorporate an expanded annual giving program as purchase our new donor management software "Network for Good". Building a larger individual donor base will complement Catch the Next's successful grant seeking program and help ensure our financial future. Catch the Next currently has two grant proposals pending, requesting a total of \$50,000.
