Program / Project Description:

Foster children arrive with little notice into homes that may not be prepared for their specific age. They also may not stay very long in these homes. Having to purchase these items at a moment's notice has proven to be a deterrent for some quality foster homes. We do not believe that this should be an obstacle keeping children from being placed in amazing homes while waiting for permanency.

Our goal is to provide beds and car seats for these children at a moments notice. If they outgrow a crib, they can come back for a larger bed. If they outgrow their car seat, they can trade it in for the size up. No child should feel "out of place" because they show up and don't have a bed all their own. These beds and car seats get returned when they are no longer needed so that another child in need can use them.

We are looking to fund this program with a total of \$29,900. This amount of money will allow us to purchase the following:

- 100 car seats and booster seats for children varying in age from newborns to 5 years old.
- 50 toddler beds for children ages 2-5 yrs.
- 50 twin beds for children ages 5-18 yrs.
- 50 cribs for children ages 0-2 yrs.

It will also cover the expenses associated with storing the items and having someone available to connect the children and families with the resources. There is a need for someone specific to manage the inventory of the items, purchase items when needed and arrange distribution to the families.

Evaluation Plan:

Every family fills out an intake forms, so that we can track the ages and gender of each placement, as well as what items were given. Our inventory tracking software manages the coming and going of each bed and car seat, as well as notifying us of expiration dates (car seats expire after seven years). We are also continuing to track the lifespan of each item, to determine its durability and quality.

Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

We continue to connect with local churches and organizations to grow our monthly recurring donations in order to continue to meet the growing needs of the children in our community. In the past year the number of children we have served has increased by 126%, and we are working to increase our donations to match that statistic this year.
