## **Program / Project Description:**

Starlight needs your help to bring joy and comfort to hospitalized children in the San Antonio area. Imagine the delight of patients and pediatric staff alike when we deliver 1,500 fun and super-soft Starlight Gowns to Methodist Children's Hospital, Children's Hospital of San Antonio and University Hospital. This will directly impact at least 1,500 children in the San Antonio area. While some children may take the gowns home with them as a keepsake to remind them of their bravery or to use for future treatments, some gowns will remain in inventory at the hospital to improve the hospital experience for numerous children time and again.

As soft as your favorite T-Shirt, the Starlight Gowns are a revolutionary addition to the hospital experience. Tested and crafted to pass infection control protocols and regulations, these gowns are equipped with side ties that enable kids to be fully covered, doing away with the exposed back of a typical hospital gown. The side ties facilitate better rest, as a child can sleep on their back without knots poking them the whole night through. The MRI ready plastic shoulder snaps allow for easy access to ports, heart monitors and IVs, enabling the child to remain clothed during check-ups and treatments. Perhaps, most importantly, these gowns come in fun and exciting patterns that help to distract and entertain kids who may otherwise feel isolated and scared. When a kid can focus on her R2D2 gown, for example, she is going to be less focused on the pain she is experiencing or the surgery she is about to go through.

Starlight Gowns lessen the fear and uncertainty children face in the hospital. We have heard from hospital partners and parents alike that when a kid gets handed a Starlight Gown over the drab, scratchy regular hospital gown, they are more engaged and empowered, making a difficult situation that much brighter. With your help, we can engage and empower hospitalized kids in the San Antonio area.

## **Evaluation Plan:**

Starlight evaluates programs through surveys and ongoing anecdotal feedback from children, parents and healthcare professionals. The surveys are used to gauge program success and effectiveness while shaping future programmatic improvements and changes. With the help of one of our early Starlight Gown investors, Starlight was able to conduct a specific study on the impact of the Starlight Gowns this past year.

In addition, Starlight Children's Foundation ensures that all programs operated by the organization are routinely measured and analyzed to determine the impact that the program is making on children and partner facilities and for overall community impact.

#### Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

We have every intention to continue growing our Starlight Gown program. As long as our hospital partners continue to find it effective and impactful in pediatric patient care, we will continue to seek funding to support this program. We will also continue securing feedback from hospital partners to improve and grow all Starlight programs in order to make the largest impact we can.
