Program / Project Description:							

Our BRP Scholar program is designed to educate and expose students to the board, business, and community sectors at a much younger age by having professionals who can empathize with them, while educating the students on various topics that include, but not limited to: board service, entrepreneurship, leadership development, asset mapping, credit, personal finance, IT, wage negotiation, and how to access and pay for college, to name a few of the session topics covered during the program. Our founder, Salena S. Guipzot, grew up nomadic, living on the streets since a young child, is why this work is so important to the organization and her. We will support their education by providing exposure to topics that they may never be exposed to unless they attend business school or have entrepreneurial parents. Our goal is to serve 20 homeless students by partnering with SARAH - Youth Action Board (YAB) to help deliver our curriculum to the YAB group. We will administer a post survey per session to gauge their understanding of the topic, the knowledge acquired during the session, and their comprehension of the subject matter covered. We will work with our community partners and community health works to help us identify and recruit more students. Our program is 100% virtual, for those without a reliable device we are able to loan one out for the duration of the program. After the completion of the 4 Saturday sessions, three hours long, in which the YAB members will be paid for their time. We will have a mock-board meeting, in which we will inform the students there is an opportunity to serve on BRP's board of directors for a year. Our current Board Scholar, Tania Gibson's term, will expire in December 2020. In addition to our board opportunity, we will provide other board opportunities for students to apply for, in doing so, teaching them to leverage their YAB board experience for greater personal and professional leadership opportunities within our city.

#### **Evaluation Plan:**

Our evaluation will include both formative (process) and summative (impact) performance measures, covering these three main areas:

- 1. Academic achievement during BRP Scholar program. Data will be collected, disaggregated and assessed.
- 2. Behavioral factors, including analysis of attendance, disciplinary referrals, and attrition.
- 3. Aspirational and future success-related factors, including analysis of vocational exploration assessments.

## Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

Our work will be sustained by either our founder or individual donors who give of their time or money to cause. Our founder serves on the SARAH board as the consumer board member, we will continue to partner with San Antonio Regional Alliance of the Homeless (SARAH), City of San Antonio (COSA), Haven for Hope, and Thrive to provide our services to the youth homeless population.
