The Atonement Academy is the 25-year-old parish school of Our Lady of The Atonement Catholic Church, located near UTSA in northwest San Antonio. Approximately half of our students are parishioners and our students come from more than 25 different San Antonio area zip codes. The school is PreK through Grade 12 and wins accolades for a rigorous curriculum and award-winning music program. The Atonement Academy's Upper School is currently ranked #1 on the list for "Best Catholic High Schools in the San Antonio Area," according to Niche, a national research company that analyzes the performance of schools across the country.

The Catholic parish is unique in that it is not a part of the Archdiocese of San Antonio. Similar to churches on military bases, this parish belongs to an Ordinariate, a system of churches that initially was comprised of converts from the Episcopal Church. The Atonement Academy is the only school in this Houston-based Ordinariate system and as such must rely on independent fundraising to augment tuition and support from the local parish.

HVAC System

Air conditioning is essential in the hot climate of South Texas. Classrooms can overheat very quickly on hot days which results in reduced learning. When students are exposed to the hot weather it can reduce concentration, problem solving, social skills and more. A comfortable classroom environment is essential for learning, but an efficient system will also save the school money on their energy bills.

Ten of our classrooms for our youngest students are located in the oldest part of our school, in a wonderful structurally sound building with very old HVAC systems. Shortly after school began in August, two units of the system needed repeated repair, and we have been told that they will need to be replaced. The proposed units that will be purchased and installed are high quality units with incredible efficiency. The air conditioner unit will use 20% less energy ad emit 20% less carbon dioxide.

It is difficult for learning to take place in hot classrooms, and while windows and fans are helpful, the noise that comes in from outdoors as well as the whirring sound of the fans make concentration difficult for our young students. The classrooms affected by the faulty system finished out the fall season using fans, but before school resumes in August, we must seek funding for replacing the HVAC systems to cool these classrooms.

Campus Security (Controlled Access Entry)

A safe learning environment is essential for students of all ages. Without it they are unable to focus on learning the skills needed for a successful education and future. In a perfect world, our teachers should focus on educating and engaging their students, and not worry about external threats or concerns. Unfortunately, we don't live in a perfect world. Our beautiful school campus is nestled in a quiet neighborhood in the Northwest quadrant of San Antonio. But we are cognizant that having a security system is of critical importance, whether we are located in a quiet neighborhood or busy intersection.

The proposed access system selected is BRIVO and it will be installed on two primary doors with surveillance cameras, located at the main building entrance and the high school entrance. Due to the unique style of the doors, we have been informed that it will be necessary to provide specialized integrated locking and door retraction hardware to secure these doors.

BRIVO is unique because it is a cloud based solution that is backed up and managed through BRIVO's cloud. The BRIVO system will be easily managed through any PC, Tablet or Smart Phone which will allow administration to provide mobile credentials (MobilePass) for faculty and staff to gain access to a door using their phones. Administration will also be able to remotely add/delete users, perform an emergency lockdown, and see user history in real-time. Megapixel IP cameras and intercom system will be installed on the exterior of the building covering each door area. This will allow administration to quickly view the video and the card use at each door through the cloud interface. The surveillance cameras will be fully integrated into the BRIVO app, stored locally for a minimum of 30 days and backed up to the cloud for 30 days as a precaution against disaster recovery.

A comprehensive service and support plan will be added to the system which will cover the system for life, to include repair or replacement of any malfunctioning parts, free onsite service calls, unlimited online/on phone tech support, remote diagnostics and support, and priority service through BRIVO's special hotline

Campus Security (Visitor Management System)

Another layer of protection The Atonement Academy would like to include to its Campus Security Program is The Raptor(R) Visitor Management system. With just a swipe of the visitor's driver's license this software program will automatically screen visitor's and instantly notify the school of any and all potential security issues and keep unwanted entrants out. Approved visitors will have a Visitor Badge printed with their name and picture. The system is also equipped with a panic button that will allow the front office receptionist to instantly alert school officials and first responders.

A \$20,000 grant from the Najim Foundation will support The Atonement Academy's efforts in providing a welcoming and secure learning environment for our scholars, faculty and staff when classes resume on August 12th.

Evaluation Plan:

The success of the Campus Improvement Program will be measured as follows:

HVAC System

One of The Atonement Academy's biggest expenses is its utility bill. An evaluation of the academy's existing HVAC infrastructure and needs was conducted in the fall. The HVAC system designed will provide and maintain space temperature and humidity conditions while actually improving learning productivity. The system's energy efficiency components will also save the administration money.

Campus Safety

Children Impacted:

A safe learning environment is essential for students, faculty and staff. The proposed access system will secure the main building and the high school located across the Piazza with magnetic locks and a two-way surveillance camera and intercom system which will be monitored by the school's front office receptionist. The automated school background check for campus visitors will add another layer of security. The receptionist will instantly be notified of any potential and security issues with campus visitors.

Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

The Atonement Academy board and staff established a funding plan to ensure scholars continue to receive a Catholic classical education. To sustain the Campus Improvement Program the academy will add the cost to the operations budget.

To further increase The Atonement Academy's fundraising capacity, the academy hired a Director of Development to establish collaborative and philanthropic partnerships. We continue to pursue funding from a variety of sources including individuals, corporations, foundations, civic groups, and special events. The Atonement Academy provides an accredited classical education and unparalleled Catholic culture for each of our scholars which inspires the development of both faith and reason. Our faculty and staff consists of accomplished and dedicated professionals who engage students every day, encourage them to become life-long learners, instill a love of their faith and prepare them to succeed in life. They maintain the highest integrity and concern for every scholar's education and personal growth.
