**Program / Project Description:** 

Medical Needs

Harvey E. Najim Charitable Foundation Priorities:

Hopecam's mission is to overcome the social isolation experienced by children diagnosed with cancer through the use of tablets, laptops, and internet technologies to connect the child with his or her school, doctors and support system.

Each year, close to 16,000 children in the U.S. are diagnosed with cancer and undergo treatments that dramatically limit their ability to go to school. On average, Hopecam children miss between 136 and 180 days of school. Among the first side-effects is isolation from their classmates. Hopecam gives each child a tablet computer, Internet access if the family is without, and then works with the child's school, providing them with needed equipment and support. 71% of our students attend Title 1 schools and over 50% live in homes that cannot afford internet access - we provide all equipment at no charge to the family or school. Hopecam helps to bridge the digital divide for not just the child, but for all family members during this difficult time.

The need for Hopecam's services has never been greater. In 2020, COVID-19 caused a widespread switch from in-person medical visits to virtual ones. The children in our program now depend on their tablets, Chromebooks and Wi-Fi hotspots for telehealth, communicating not only with their friends and family but also with their medical teams. Our technology provides a safe way for immune-compromised children to receive essential health services and meet regularly with doctors, social workers and counselors.

Funding for "Champions of Hope - San Antonio" will go directly towards the program expenses for children with cancer living in the San Antonio region to connect with their schools and doctors using tablets, laptop computers and Wifi hotspots. We will call upon our strong partnership with Methodist Children's and The Children's Hospital of San Antonio - CHRISTUS Health and connect more children from this region. This project will cost approximately \$22,500, with \$12,500 already funded by committed partners, including Northwestern Mutual, Logitech, Zoom and our Board Members. We hope you will join Hopecam to connect even more children with cancer to their classrooms, doctors and support systems.

Each Hopecam connection costs between \$1,000 and \$1,500. This includes all equipment for the family and school, tech accessories and insurance, internet access for the family if they are without, and all program expenses. We have budgeted \$22,500 for this program, which will allow us to connect 20-25 children. With any generous support towards this program, we will fund as many children as possible.

#### **Evaluation Plan:**

The feedback we receive about our program through formal surveys and informal exchanges (emails and phone calls with parents, school staff, and hospital social workers) is shared with our Board of Directors and helps us grow internally, guiding the changes we make to the Hopecam program to meet the current need and improve program delivery. Positive evaluation feedback and spontaneous testimonials from children, parents, and school staff help us to grow and help us advocate better with schools, hospitals, and families about the importance of maintaining social connections when dealing with a critical illness.

#### Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

This project is sustainable thanks to our great partnership with Logitech and Zoom, who donate equipment that accounts for half of the project budget. Their dedication and support of Hopecam's mission will continue.

Our program is sustainable because unfortunately, there is no cure for childhood cancer. We hope that one day there is no longer a need for Hopecam but until that day, while children continue to be isolated because of cancer, we strive to connect them virtually using the latest technology to be able to see their friends, classrooms and support systems. Our mission is to decrease the loneliness and anxiety they experience during this frightening time, which in the end helps to promote healing by defeating isolation. Currently Hopecam helps approximately 360 children annually but over 16,000 children are diagnosed with cancer every year. Our goal over the next 5 years is to help as many children as possible defeat social isolation and never have a waitlist for our services.
