Program / Project Description:						

Friends of the Bexar County Child Welfare Board, Inc. is the nonprofit of the Bexar County Child Welfare Board (CWB). The CWB is a statutorily created board tasked by the Bexar County Commissioners Court with advocating on behalf of all abused and neglected children within Bexar County. CWB and Friends work directly with the local Bexar County Child Protective Services Department and serve ALL, on average 5,000, children in their care. Most nonprofits serve subsets of those children. CWB and Friends offers direct support, programming, and plans events for CPS children and families. Our entity is 100% volunteer-based with staff support provided by the County.

Prior to the pandemic, the Child Welfare Board through our nonprofit, the Friends of the Bexar County Child Welfare Board, Inc, received monthly donations from jurors who donated their jury stipend to our direct services program. Our direct services program funds the following line items in support of families involved with CPS: Cribs and Bed, Car Seats and Strollers, Medical Support (Baby Helmets), Transportation Assistance, Baby Items (bouncers, walkers, etc.), and Household Support items (cleaning supplies, toiletries, fire extinguishers so that families can be certified to be foster or adoption homes). We administer this program with the assistance of our local CPS staff, so approvals and accountability are in place for each request within the mentioned line items.

Due to the pandemic our main source of fundraising has completely dried up. We made do in 2020 with a combination of County donated CARES Act dollars and rainy day funds we held in an investment account. The CARES Act dollars were spent down by the end of 2020 per prior federal mandate, and there is little left in our rainy day fund. Consequently, the Board has decided to turn to the private sector to raise our 2021 budget for the Direct Services Program we administer.

The NFF request is for \$35,000 for beds and cribs to serve an estimated 140 children. Beds and cribs are our most requested item from CPS caseworkers on behalf of families. We fund around \$40,000 worth of beds every year. In January, we secured a \$5,000 stop gap grant from H-E-B to fund the early months of 2021, while our Board works diligently to secure the rest of the funds needed for 2021.

The NFF request is also for \$8,500 for our PAL program. The PAL program is the Preparation for Adult Living for youth (those aged 16+) in CPS care. The program provides case management and support with the goal of preparing them for self-sufficiency upon adulthood. Through collaboration with the Youth Transitioning into Adulthood organization and CPS, Friends of CWB funds and helps coordinate a myriad of services and events for the PALs youth, such as: High School Graduation Celebrations, Life Skills Assessments, Financial Literacy Courses, Aging Out Seminars, Christmas Celebration, Birthday Recognition, and Job Readiness Programs.

The NFF request would fund the following PALs support program items:

\$2,250 to fund a high school graduation celebration including gifts

\$2,000 to purchase Beds in a Bag

\$2,750 to purchase Kitchens in a Box

\$1,500 for Birthday Gift Cards (We have secured a \$4,000 contribution from Bexar County Judge Nelson Wolff for this project as our annual budget is usually \$5,500).

Evaluation Plan:

CPS and County staff compile monthly reports showing how many families and children are served by our direct services program.

Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

Private sector fundraising until the jury fund source is back to pre-pandemic revenue generation.
