Program / Project Description:					

Hopecam's mission is to allow children to socialize, sharing the normal events and conversations of childhood from celebrating a birthday to checking out who has lost a tooth. When a child is diagnosed with cancer, it is important to keep the child connected to school and friends. Research shows that children who felt more supported from their classmates during cancer treatment were "less depressed, less anxious, and had higher self-esteem" than children who did not feel supported by classmates (Suzuki and Kato, 2003).

Back then, video conferencing applications had not been invented and most computers were desktops costing more than \$1,000 each. Hopecam helped as many children as it had resources. Over time, Hopecam has developed an expertise in working with schools--persuading them to connect with children by overcoming red tape and fears about "exposing" school children to other children with serious illnesses. In the ensuing years, voice over Internet protocols have become easy to use, and more important, computers have become tablets that are significantly lower in cost and robust needing much less IT support. These advances in technology and lower costs have made it possible for Hopecam to reach out to significantly more children at a cost of about \$1,000 per child. Simultaneously word has spread among the pediatric cancer community about Hopecam's program.

In the calendar year 2018, Hopecam reached a milestone and has connected over 1,800 children throughout the United States and abroad. Each year, close to 16,000 children are diagnosed with cancer, and undergo treatments that dramatically limit their ability to go to school and interact with their friends. Among the first side-effects experienced by the child is isolation from their friends, their schools and classmates. Hopecam gives each child a tablet computer, Internet access if the family is without, and then works with the child's school to facilitate and secure their participation, providing them with needed equipment and support.

With modern technology and coordination through families, teachers and healthcare providers, Hopecam links children to the lives they had before their diagnosis, acting as a bridge toward recovery. Our "Give Hope, Get Connected" program, increases our assistance to children in the San Antonio area. This grant would be used to purchase tablets and laptop computers, along with Wifi hotspots for children diagnosed with cancer and other life-threatening illnesses living specifically in the San Antonio area. Hopecam will expand our reach by reaching out to hospitals, schools and social workers to find more children that we can help. For children who are being treated far from home, Hopecam provides a way to stay in touch with loved ones and support networks.

Evaluation Plan:

Hopecam has developed data management systems to monitor the outcomes resulting from providing a Hopecam connection. Families receive pre-and post-connection surveys to help in the evaluation of program and to improve our systems. In addition, Hopecam continues to work with George Mason University, College of Education and Human Development to conduct a credited class that studies the impact of Hopecam on the client, family, friends, and school that would be used to design a future empirical study that would examine impact and evaluate the Hopecam process. This has continued to help us shed light on the issue of how to mitigate social isolation during treatment for childhood cancer. Further, The Kennedy Krieger Institute at Johns Hopkins University with the Mind, Brain, and Teaching Program will be working with Hopecam families and students to participate in a study they are conducting about school re-entry experiences.

Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

This program is sustainable because 1/3 of the project is already funded through our partnership with Logitech. Logitech is providing technology to the teachers in the classroom. We have been given Connect Towers, which are web-cameras that contain a speaker system. Each teacher can control the camera with a remote to help the student at home learn and see what is going on in the classroom. We are grateful for the commitment of support from Logitech.
