# **Program / Project Description:**

The Rotary Club of San Antonio in partnership with City Year San Antonio is pleased to announce its 21st Kingdom for Kids playground project. For many of our projects we enlist City Year to source potential locations. We have chosen Carvajal Elementary as our next deserving school campus. Carvajal currently feeds to neighboring Rhodes Middle School where City Year is currently working with a Team. We intend to complete our project on October 17th of this year.

Carvajal Early Childhood Campus located at 225 Arizona is an elementary school in San Antonio, TX, in the San Antonio ISD school district serving children from pre k to 5th grade. It was recently expanded to include children ages 5 to 11. The campus playground currently only serves the toddler ages 3-5 years of age. We intend to build a new play structure to serve the older kids.

More about Carvajal: As of the 2018-2019 school year, it had 394 students. As the school reopened in the Head Start program this year the enrollment climbed over 30% to a current enrollment of 514. Head Start is a federally funded program provided at no cost for qualifying families that provides education, health and dental screenings, nutrition, family support, and training services for families in need.

The school received an accountability rating of C. 63.7% of students were considered at risk of dropping out of school. 23.1% of students were enrolled in bilingual and English language learning programs. The student population is 96.2% Hispanic with 2% African American and 2% White Caucasian. The average Teacher experience is 11.2 years with an average teacher's salary of \$55,087, which is \$965 more than the state average.

The club will work with Carvajal Elementary leadership to ensure all projects and structures meet their standards and the children are safe.
