Program / Project Description:

The Spare Pair Underwear program provides disadvantaged elementary and middle school students with a fresh pair of underwear after they have had an accident in class. Elementary and middle school nurses receive 150 pair of underwear to assist students, keeping them clean, confident and in class. When the student has an accident, they are sent to the nurse who provides a new pair of underwear and the student spends an average of 7 minutes changing and returning to class. UFE surveyed participating nurses and found that when a spare pair is not available in the clinic a child spends, on the average, 97 minutes in the clinic. Gaining 90 minutes in learning time represents one and a half to two periods of school-- important because we know children drop out of school when they miss the basics and also diminishes a child's vulnerability to bullies.

92% of school nurse participants surveyed noted that Undies for Everyone is their only source of underwear for disadvantaged children in the school after they have an accident. A nurse sent along this note "THANK YOU, THANK YOU, THANK YOU for the undies I received just before Christmas for my school, Clifford Davis Elementary School, in Ft. Worth, Texas. I am the school nurse for these 814 kiddos and 80% of my children are refugees and really in need of underwear. Again, my utmost thanks. They are making a huge difference in these children's lives!"

UFE serves 386 San Antonio area elementary and middle schools with 57,600 pair of undies. In alignment with the Najim Family Foundation's geographic area of service, all of the schools are in Bexar and Medina counties.

Evaluation Plan:

Undies for Everyone works with a volunteer statistician from Rice University's Kinder Institute who creates surveys sent to participating school nurses and analyzes results. Information gathered from these surveys help UFE understand the benefits of the program and how we can change the system for a better outcome. In 2020, UFE will send an additional survey to school administrators, parents and teachers to gather more information about assisting students.

Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

Undies for Everyone is committed to serving children in need. We will continue to fund raise until all expenses are covered each year as we expand within and outside of Texas. Each year, support for the mission of UFE grows as the community learns more about the challenges children face without the basic dignity of underwear.
