Program / Project Description:

Our goal is to help students from low-income communities attend a week-long Young Life camp alongside their mentors. Each scholarship we offer significantly reduces the cost of the trip for our students and gives them the opportunity to experience adventure, participate in confidence-building activities, and grow in their faith in a safe and memorable environment. In a week of Young Life camp, students will participate in the following: basketball, volleyball, fishing, swim lessons, pool games, horseback riding, archery, hiking, go-karts, karaoke, family-style meals with friends and mentors, small-group discussions about God, friendship, family issues, relational challenges, and future goals, ropes/challenge course, time of quiet reflection, journal-writing, art and craft, bible teaching, and more.

Young Life camping with teenagers interrupts and addresses several challenges of teenage life: technology overload, isolation, unhealthy family relationships, peer pressure, and limited opportunity. Kids from low-income and high-risk environments are able to experience beauty, order, adventure, and community in a unique way at Young Life camp that changes their perspective even after they return home. Often our students will leave their home city for the first time when we take them to Young Life camp, and return excited about college in a new city, dreams beyond the next day, and confidence in their own autonomy as emerging adults.

Young Life camp also forges trust and friendship between our students and mentors on a level difficult to reach in the course of normal interaction. The unique challenges and joys of Young Life camp, from the obstacle course to small group discussions, pave the way for transforming conversations and experiences that allow our youth to learn from our mentors and gain confidence from their relationship like never before.

Evaluation Plan:

We follow up with our students year-round and give them opportunity to process and apply what they have learned while at camp. We evaluate our success at inclusive camping by annually increasing our number of students per year who apply to camp and receive scholarship funds so we know that our camp program is not limited to students who can afford it.

Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

We hope to soon build a camp scholarship endowment of \$500,000 that funds San Antonio campership for many years to come. In the meantime, we have over 75 donors in San Antonio who contribute to camp scholarship. This project would allow us to increase the camp scholarships offered to 89 this year. As our ministry grows, this increased funding for camp is crucial.
