# **Program / Project Description:**

#### **Need Statement:**

When children need life-saving medical care, they may spend most of their time in the hospital receiving treatment and tests, especially when they are away from home and their usual routines. Children may be separated from their families and other familiar people for an extended period of time. The abrupt change in life can cause anxiety and cause added stress and be emotionally and mentally draining for both the child and their parents. A recent study found that play can alleviate these side effects. In fact, it can be significantly beneficial for pre-operative children or those undergoing cancer treatments. A well-made play space can help these patients develop emotionally, physically, and socially. Whether they have disabilities or not - all kids will have an equal opportunity to partake in physical play in our playrooms and playgrounds. By equipping children of all abilities with inclusive environments and the skills to play together more independently, children will feel nurtured, encouraged, respected, and active during play - both physically and socially - thereby creating a sense of community and support for their families. Playing gives children a piece of their normal lives back, even if it is for a brief time.

## Description:

The plan includes creating versatile, flexible, multi-purpose, multi-functional playrooms and a playground for inclusive play. We will create a design that will safely meet the needs of play for the highest number of children and their caregivers. The accessibility guidelines in the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) require most new playgrounds to comply with the standards they set forth. They also require existing playgrounds undergoing alterations to comply.

- o An accessible playground must have available, unobstructed routes to the playground and connecting play equipment.
- o The playground must include at least one of each type of ground-level play component on an accessible route.
- o At least 50% of the playground's elevated play components must be on an accessible route.
- o Ramps must have handrails on both sides.
- o Playgrounds must use specific safety surfacing that has met ADA criteria.

### **Evaluation Plan:**

We will consider the project successful when all families and children who stay at our Sid Katz location can access and play regardless of their physical or mental limitations.
