Established in 1981, Ronald McDonald House has 58 family rooms in 2 locations in the Medical Center and 1 inside the Children's Hospital downtown. Ronald McDonald House Charities of San Antonio serves 4600 seriously ill children and their family members in a typical year. Ronald McDonald House saves our families over \$2.1 million in lodging and other expenses they would otherwise incur while seeking critical medical services for their children.

The services of RMHC are unduplicated. Our families can solely focus on the needs of their sick child with the support of RMHC. They are minutes away from their child and the medical team. Being close to their child each day often results in shorter hospital stays with improved medical

outcomes. Families live here for days, months, or years while awaiting a life-saving transplant or attending rehab that is unavailable in

their hometown. Without us, they would be separated from their child or forgo critical treatment.

Families with a child requiring significant and even life sustaining care are under tremendous amounts of stress and a place to play, to relax and unplug, are essential.

Winter Storm Uri caused significant damage in San Antonio, including our oldest location on Sid Katz in the Medical Center. This facility suffered 10 different broken pipes and the failure of the fire suppression system, resulting in \$1 million plus in water damages to contents and structure, including the two playrooms inside the house.

The project is to upgrade and outfit one playroom for preschoolers and a 2nd playroom for preteens and teens. This request also includes upgrading an outside family area with a sun cover, picnic tables and grills. Insurance will cover most of the repair costs from Uri, but only a minimal portion of the contents that were 15+ years old already. This funding is needed to equip these rooms with the best components and materials to help our clients relax, reconnect and replenish.

Evaluation Plan:

We will consider the project successful when all families and children who stay at our Sid Katz location can access and play regardless of their physical or mental limitations.
