According to the City of San Antonio (2017), Bexar County presents significant disparities in poverty, 18.4% of our population. Poverty has a direct correlation to the females, minorities, and children being impacted by health issues and, ultimately, premature mortality. Known as one of the "fattest cities in the U.S.", UT Health researchers have noted that change cannot be only medical--it has to include physical, mental, and nutritional lifestyle changes.

Spurs Give has heard our community and now is responding with programming that breaks the bounds of mobilization and includes holistic health and wellness, sports nutrition, and the use of innovative technology to capture the intrinsic motivation of today's youth. Our program model start with children, but trickles into family systems to inspire generational change.

Data shows that keeping kids in sports addresses truancy, career development, decreases chances of teen pregnancy, and decreases incarceration rates. By impacting over 10,000 kids a year through Spurs Youth Basketball League and SAFC Micro League, we have a duty to equip our future leaders with skills they can use on and off the court. We know that 57% of business leaders attribute their success to youth sports. We are on a mission to create future leaders regardless of the zip code they were born in--every child deserves access to safe spaces to play, learn, and grow.

Our Youth Sports programming includes:

-Partnership with Positive Coaching Alliance (for players and parents)

-Train the Mind (mental health) demonstrations and app access for all participants and families

-Full scholarship for SAFC Micro League (50% IDEA Public School students)

-Exclusive access to Spurs coaches and players

-Leadership, sportsmanship, and passion development

-Focus on attaining and retaining female athletes

The Future of Youth Sports with Your Help:

-Expand SAFC Micro League into out of school programming and Spurs Give Play SA park locations

-Partner with other foundations to make youth sports ultra accessible

-Increase Youth Sports participation by 1,000 children and 40 coaches (by 2021) with Police Athletic League and programming at San Antonio Parks & Recreation sites

Evaluation Plan:

Evaluation methods for the Spurs Give Youth Sports program includes:

-Parent and coach surveys

-Qualitative check-ins with players (several of which have gone on to work for Spurs Sports & Enterainment)

-Review of service areas and zip code to ensure we are reaching the most at risk communities (as determined by SA 2020 and Up Partnership)

Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

The Spurs Give Youth Sports program has been sustained for 31+ years. Starting as Coach Gregg Popovich's midnight league, this program has become a staple to San Antonio, Austin, and South Texas communities with impact to over 375,000 families, 46,000 coaches, and 65 sites. To sustain this project, we have outlined funding agreements with partners such as IDEA Public Schools, San Antonio Area Foundation, and Pizza Hut (30 year sponsor). We have a team dedicated to carrying out an annual fundraising plan and establishing an endowment (2022) for future growth in program impact.
