Program / Project Description:

Little Flower School, located near the campus of the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Little Flower, currently has 84 students-the majority reside in the surrounding neighborhood, located in the 78201 zip code. The school is in a low-income, primarily Latino (96% of the population of the zip code 78201 where the school is located is Hispanic), Westside neighborhood. Median household incomes in the surrounding zip codes are \$32,000 per year. Half of student population has minimal access to technology at home. 43 students qualify for free lunch and 4 for reduced lunch based on federal guidelines.

The last technology upgrade at the school was ten years ago. The current upgrades will be used to enhance the current micro-school curriculum by providing additional stimulating information and interactive opportunities so students can fully embrace the concept being taught in the classrooms. Teachers who use instructional video and technology report that students retain more information, understand concepts more rapidly, and are more enthusiastic about what they are learning. With up-to-date video/computer technology as one component of a thoughtful lesson plan, students often make new connections between curriculum topics, and discover links between these topics and the world outside of the classroom.

The technology upgrade will provide 2 laptops to be shared by 10 teachers, a Promethean Board (interactive white board) and stand for each teacher, 80 chrome books, plus 2 desktops and a laptop for the administrative and cafeteria staff to share. Funds from the Najim Foundation will be used towards the chrome books that will serve only the students (\$19,578.40 for chrome books and headsets).

The technology upgrade will enhance the learning model embraced by Little Flower School. The micro school model can be tailored to the individual student and draws from the strengths of other models of education, such as homeschooling co-ops and the "one room schoolhouses" of yesteryear. Traditional grading methods remain in place to facilitate transition to high school. Over the past few years, Little Flower School has been slowly adopting this model in various ways, based on the successes of our previous multilevel classroom experiences, along with positive feedback from students and parents; therefore, we decided to adopt this model fully for the 2020-2021 school year. Benefits of micro school include:

o Instruction is individualized to meet the developmental needs of students academically, emotionally, and socially.

o Students' progress at their pace, individuality is valued!

o Students develop stronger relationships with their peers and teachers.

o Students acquire values that are congruent with the teachings of the Catholic Church and challenge themselves both socially and academically.

LFS is accredited by the Texas Catholic Conference Education Department and recognized by the Texas Education Agency while implementing curricula which meet and exceed TEA requirements.

Evaluation Plan:

Students are evaluated throughout the year with testing and quizzes. Students progress is evaluated annually through MAP Growth testing, utilizing NWEA assessments. MAP testing evaluates achievement and growth in K-12 Math, Reading, Language Usage, and Science. NWEA is a research-based not-for-profit organization that supports students and educators worldwide by creating assessment solutions that precisely measure growth and proficiency, and provide insights to help tailor instruction.

Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

Once the technology equipment is purchased, maintenance and repairs will be funded from our operating budget and no further grant funds will be needed for the project. Additionally, as the project involves multiple layers of need, funds received can be spent as soon as awarded, and easily within 12 months of receipt for the needed technology equipment.

As we have just received the bid for the needed technology upgrades, the Najim Charitable Foundation is the first foundation we have reached out to for funding. Additional funders will be identified and grants pursued over the summer.
