#### **Program / Project Description:**

This proposal asks for an investment in Texas Biomed's to create the Harvey Najim Summer Bioscience Experience and ramp up efforts to grow visionary educational programs targeting K-12 students, undergraduates, graduate students, and fellows. A grant of \$100,000 per year for five years will enable Texas Biomed to continue providing exceptional education and outreach programs while creating a new state of the art curricula, programs, spaces, and a special summer experience tailored to meet local needs in STEM education, especially in K-12 and underserved populations. The program includes Texas Biomed's establishment of an online portal to enable community access by educators, families, and students to resources that enrich and encourage the STEM experience through preeminent curriculum. The program also incorporates recruiting and sustaining an expert team to execute education and outreach activities.

Because of the unique nature of Texas Biomed's resources and sciences, the Institute can provide unique economic and educational opportunities for the next generation of STEM-educated and scientifically-focused workforce. Texas Biomed is the only campus in the world that combines Animal Biosafety Level 4 (ABSL4) laboratory and a national primate research center together dedicated to eradicating infectious diseases. Based on decades of experience, Texas Biomed provides an attractive and motivating place for students' enrichment. Its scientists, technicians, veterinarians and specialized staff participate in promoting educational programs proposed here. Also, this program will serve a vital education and economic development cog as it focuses on building the life science workforce needed for the future.

This program provides a fertile environment that encourages kindergarten through postdoctoral excellence. The Harvey Najim Summer Bioscience Experience will reach more than 500 K - 12 students in 2020 through summer tours and learning experiences. This will be accomplished because Texas Biomed, the only private, non-profit scientific organization in the city, is positioned to work more nimbly with partners, whether independent school districts, private schools, or secondary education providers. Texas Biomed also has the Discovery and Learning Initiative as a strategic emphasis in its 10-year strategic plan. The Harvey Najim Summer Bioscience Experience is a critical component, very attractive to like-minded philanthropic organizations such as the Charles Butt Foundation, the Educard Foundation, the Texas Biomedical Forum, Hixon Properties, and others.

### **Evaluation Plan:**

This program directly supports efforts to improve education, establish San Antonio as a hub for innovation and become a national leader in the life sciences industry. At the proposed rate, we anticipate reaching more than 500 students in 2020 through the summer tours and learning experiences. With the development of online learning opportunities, Texas Biomed will increase the number of students reached and increase the breadth and depth of available curricula for teachers.

This program includes metrics to measure use of online curriculum to determine how many teachers and students are being impacted by the availability of online learning tools. Additionally, teachers assisting in the development of curriculum for the program will also use this in their classrooms, expanding the reach even more. Texas Biomed is an industry leader with the capacity to serve as education partners, which will create an exceptional environment for the growth and success of science.

### Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

The program has a well-qualified and highly experienced staff of four, including a Director of Education, Development Specialist and other staff with a combined 25 years of educational programming. The Harvey Najim Summer Bioscience Experience is a part of this larger program that Texas Biomed has been doing for over 6 years and is committed to continuing the program with the help of other funders such as The Charles Butt Foundation, the Edouard Foundation, the Texas Biomedical Forum, Hixon Properties, and others. The commitment of Texas Biomed in serving the K - 12 underserved population in this community is critical in showing students the pathways to STEM-related careers at an early age. The Harvey Najim Summer Bioscience Experience will impact more than 500 local students each summer.
