Program / Project Description:

The Earn-A-Bike@School On-line Program works with San Antonio area elementary schools to provide an engaging, semester-long TEKS aligned, youth development program for students. We teach students about leading healthy and productive lives by emphasizing the importance of strong work habits, physical activity, and proper nutrition, while encouraging consistent attendance, an increase in academic performance and maintaining good behavior. Upon successful completion of the program, the students are rewarded with a newly earned bicycle, helmet, light and lock.

Our program aims to tackle two needs:

- 1) Of Edgewood ISD's student population, 97.9% are Hispanic, 91.1% are identified as economically disadvantaged, and 73.9% are identified as at-risk (at-risk indicates whether a student is currently identified as at risk of dropping out of school). In 2013-2014, Edgewood ISD had the lowest attendance rate of all San Antonio school districts; as of today 16.4% of their students take longer than four years to graduate. SA2020 has a mission to have 85% of freshman cohorts graduate in four years. The need is to raise the level of high school completion with a quality, TEKS aligned program that addresses the three drop out indicators: attendance, behavior and academic performance.
- 2) There are a limited number of quality OST programs that foster environments for family involvement. The need is to increase family engagement by providing a program that supports co-learning, communication, and sharing of knowledge.

Although our program is intended to impact the ABC (Attendance, Behavior, Coursework) metrics, we believe that student attendance ranks among the most highly important of the three. According to the National Center for Education Statistics, "Students who attend school regularly have been shown to achieve a higher levels than students that do not have regular attendance." We expect to see a 1% increase in attendance per semester per grade level (student average) touched.

Evaluation Plan:

Each student will sign a commitment letter to the Earn-A-Bike program. Attendance rates will be tracked through Earn-A-Bike and/or the school campus and recorded in Earn-A-Bike confidential records. Academic performance will be measured by participation and completion of assignments with 100% of assignments turned in. Behavior indicators will be tailored to school needs and may be measured by number of office referrals, write-ups, folder marks, etc. to align with the school/classroom discipline plans.

Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

Earn-A-Bike works to sustain the organization and fulfill its mission by:

- 1. Building partnerships and sponsorships with individuals, corporations and foundations
- 2. Board support
- 3. Fundraising platforms: the BigGive, and organizing community events
- 4. Revenue from our community bike shop, including: class fees, membership fees, sales from refurbished bikes
- 5. Shared profit from Cycling for Good campaign through San Antonio's SWell Cycle, where half of the proceeds from membership prices come to Earn-A-Bike
- 6. Additional grant requests from foundations and organizations
