#### Harvey E. Najim Family Foundation Priorities:

Substance Abuse

#### **Program / Project Description:**

For more than 40 years, San Antonio youth and families have been supported by Rise Recovery through critically needed abstinence programs and family support services. We recognize that continued substance use leads to failure in academic performance, the dissolution of the family and so many health risks that a young person should never have to experience. We also recognize that youth are vulnerable to exposure to drug and alcohol use without recognizing the dangers and risks, which can lead to life-altering events. By engaging young people, we aim to stop these behaviors while the opportunity to change the trajectory of their lives is still possible. We do this by promoting healthy alternatives to drug use, a community of peers that are choosing to live alcohol and drug free, and a support system of social service partners and family education.

Youth have access to Rise Recovery services across two community centers and in six school districts. The average age of first use reported by a Rise Recovery participant is 12 years old. Our programming targets children this young, as no other such resource exists in our community, despite the need. Approximately 55% of Rise Recovery clients are male, 54% are Hispanic and 30% fall below the federal poverty level. Rise Recovery serves youth from Kendall County (Boerne ISD) to Bexar County and across Bexar County, from the northside to the south, east and the west. Our in-person services and our virtual services give us the ability to reach people in need wherever they are, and the impact is almost immediate. In FY20, 91% of Rise Recovery youth clients were able to recognize the negative consequences of substance use within the first 30 days of active participation. In 2018 and 2019, drug and alcohol related behaviors made up the third largest behavioral issue identified in San Antonio public schools. Rise Recovery youth represent every corner of San Antonio, from Alamo Heights to the Southside. Our primary goal is to provide the highest quality care to those seeking our services regardless of where they come from. We offer a healthy community solution for change via school-based and community centered services, peer recovery coaching, sober social activities, facilitated support groups, and prevention education. Our services are accessible when our community needs us most: evenings, weekends and holidays.

**Evaluation Plan:** 

Rise Recovery conducts formal and informal surveys to measure the success of our programs. Formal surveys are conducted at each 30-day mark to assess the effectiveness of the programs and an individual's goals as they continue their recovery. The informal observations and surveys are conducted by peer counselors and assess a client's progress as they focus on recovery. In 2019, 88% of active participants in our programs for at least one year indicated that they abstained from substance use for at least six months.

#### Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

Rise Recovery has diverse sources of funding, from State grants to private foundations, individual donors and the United Way of Bexar County. Rise Recovery is in the midst its strategic planning process in which earned revenue and adapting to a changing environment is a priority.
