Medical Needs

Program / Project Description:

The early detection and treatment of eye and vision problems for children is a major public health goal. This is made increasingly important by the enhanced understanding of critical periods in human development. The earlier a vision problem is diagnosed and treated, the less the potential negative impact it may have on the child's development. 80% of a child's learning is visual, but 25% of school-aged children have vision problems that are not detected or treated and 1 in 20 are at risk for permanent vision loss. With schools transitioning to online and hybrid classroom models, vision is a key to educational success.

As I Care San Antonio continues to follow social distancing healthcare guidelines, the 10th Annual iCare4kids Day which is typically held on the third Saturday in October has been restructured again this year to include "mini kid clinics" to continue to meet the needs of our most vulnerable children.

As our doctors graciously volunteer their time and open to serving our children through such "mini kid clinics" we are grateful to be able to meet the growing demand for our services. Children will continue to be invited and will receive a free comprehensive eye exam, free glasses and free follow-up care as needed. We will continue to partner with school nurses from over 100 schools and across 10 districts and build partnerships with other organizations that serve children to ensure vision equity to all. The children do not need to have social security numbers however, they do need to be residents of San Antonio or the surrounding counties.

I Care San Antonio has four programs dedicated to children with a total budget of \$52,500, they are: iCare4kids, Kids at Risk, Visually Impaired Children's Easter Beeping Egg Event and Eye on Education.

Evaluation Plan:

I Care San Antonio evaluates the iCare4kids program by tracking the outcomes and services given, as well a patient and volunteer surveys. In addition, written feedback from school nurses is requested.

Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

iCare4kids will continue to be an important program for I Care San Antonio. The program's goal is to meet the vision needs of low-income, homeless and at-risk children in our community. In addition to reaching out to over 100 schools, I Care San Antonio reaches out specifically to at-risk teens and have added multiple iCare4kids program days expanding from a one-day, annual event to a year-round program.
