#### **Program / Project Description:**

Hope for the Future (HOPE) was established in December 2006 by Archbishop Jose H. Gomez and San Antonio community leaders as a resource to help less fortunate families who believed Catholic school education was the best choice for their children. HOPE ensures the long term commitment by helping families enroll in Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of San Antonio, thereby strengthening the vitality of area Catholic schools. Our tuition assistance program is based on a family's financial need, and assistance is distributed beginning with families most in need and is awarded until all funds are exhausted. Our mission is to help families obtain the educational and spirituals benefits of a Catholic school education. Since the creation of HOPE in December 2006, over \$25 million in tuition assistance have been awarded to nearly 20,000 children to attend Catholic school. The goal of HOPE is to provide tuition assistance to every eligible student who applies.

For over 125 years, Catholic schools have been educating children in San Antonio. Catholic school education is certainly not the only option a family has to educate their student. We have a responsibility to make certain today's youth is educated in a manner that prepares them to be successful and productive leaders of tomorrow. Parents have many options in selecting an educational institution for their child. Many schools offer subjects like English, math, and science. Catholic schools not only provide outstanding curriculum, they incorporate faith into every subject. This is what makes Catholic schools different. Catholic schools have consistently and undeniably produced exceptional citizens, scholars, and leaders. Catholic education prepares students to be successful because it is more than just academics taught to students; it is the development of a deep and enduring sense of faith and moral character.

Catholic schools require a sacrifice on the part of parents, families and parishes, but the results are undeniable and visible all across our city. Parents want the best for their children and so families struggle and work hard juggling multiple jobs in order for their children to receive a better education that would set them up with a brighter future. Enrolling in a Catholic school is beyond just choosing a better education: It is about choosing a better life! Most families can manage about 2/3 of the student's tuition, and come to Hope for the Future for the remaining amount. Because of the economic and social impact of the Covid-19 pandemic, the need for financial assistance is greater than ever. Many families have suffered additional hardships due to loss of employment and illness. Most of the more than 1500 children who will receive tuition assistance this school year live in the San Antonio inner-city, mainly Hispanic, impoverished and over 50% from single parent homes with a combined household income of \$38,061.

For many families tuition is the main barrier preventing parents from enrolling their child in one of the 38 Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of San Antonio. It is the families who have less and struggle financially who rely on agencies like Hope for the Future for tuition assistance to send their children to Catholic school. During the unprecedented 2020-21 school year, Catholic Schools have successfully offered both in person and online learning to families in a safe environment for teachers, staff and students since August. This has provided a safe environment, stability and seamless continuation of education and hope to the families of our Catholic Schools.

Given that cost remains the number one reason parents can't send their children to Catholic school, HOPE continues to work and come to the aid of families through the help of businesses, parishes, individuals and generous foundations such as The Najim Family Foundation. The goal of HOPE is to provide tuition assistance to every eligible student who applies. The need is critical, in light of the Covid-19 global pandemic and the economic impact felt by all families and HOPE is committed to assist as many families as we can. Hope for the Future is able to meet 15% of the total financial need in our schools. Raising \$1.8 million with the remarkable help of The Najim Family Foundation will truly give HOPE to these 3,400 families looking for help and will set them on a trajectory of success!

#### **Evaluation Plan:**

Hope for the Future follows up with school principals, monitors grades, attendance and citizenship/participation of the children who have received tuition assistance. This monitoring follows the HOPE awardees throughout their school career.

#### Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

Hope for the Future will be sustained indefinitely through active solicitation of funds and supporters. Each year HOPE is funded through private donations, special events, corporate partners, Archbishop's Appeal and foundation grants. Spreading the mission and awareness of Hope for the Future is imperative to the economic sustainability of the agency. HOPE is active on all forms of media. All schools in the archdiocese support HOPE through their publicity using their websites, parish bulletins, newsletters, staff, and Principals. Families potentially eligible for tuition assistance are encouraged and assisted in applying for HOPE. The Archdiocese is committed to the effective operation, curriculum compliance and governance of the Archdiocesan Catholic schools. Hope for the Future serves all of the Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of San Antonio, and families with children who attend a Catholic school are eligible to apply to Hope for the Future for tuition assistance.
