**Togs For Tots** 

#### Harvey E. Najim Family Foundation Priorities:

Food, Shelter and Clothing

#### **Program / Project Description:**

To support the "Togs for Tots" program by providing new clothing to economically disadvantaged children.

According to the Annie E. Casey Foundation's Kids Count data, about one-quarter of San Antonio's children live in poverty. For their parents, providing basic needs for their very young children can be a hardship. Togs For Tots seeks to help these economically disadvantaged families by providing their newborn through preschool children with new clothing, personal care supplies, an age-appropriate book, and a bilingual developmental education book. The program works with 42 social service agencies covering the greater San Antonio area. Through these referrals, more than 5,500 children are served annually.

Infants in the program receive a layette containing a gown handmade by Assistance League members, onesies, sleepers, receiving blankets, socks, a cap, body wash, and baby lotion. Older children (six months through age four) receive shirts and pants, a coat, underwear, socks, body wash, toothpaste, a toothbrush, a comb, and a hairbrush. Every item provided is high-quality and brand new. This year, the program is expanding to include pajamas at all age levels which will require additional funds.

Parents served by this program often lack the financial resources, family support, and sometimes the child-rearing knowledge they need to adequately provide and care for their children. Togs For Tots provides each child's parents with "Watch Me Grow from Head to Toe," a booklet designed to help educate them about a baby's expected growth and progress, to stress good parenting skills, and to emphasize the importance of immunizations. The booklet, produced by Assistance League, is written in English and Spanish to ensure that all parents served by Togs For Tots will have access to this essential information.

Members of Assistance League - all of whom are volunteers - handle all aspects of the program, including: a. maintaining an inventory of clothing, grooming supplies, and books; b. interacting with referring agencies, filling agencies' orders, soliciting agencies' evaluations of the program, and c. administering the program's budget to assure efficient use of funds.

#### **Evaluation Plan:**

Qualitative measurements will look at number of children served, number of agencies participating, and budget compliance. Quantitative measurement is more difficult: Assistance League does not have direct contact with the children served by the program or their parents. Each year, Assistance League solicits input from participating agencies about the value of the program to their clients, the efficiency with which the program's service is delivered, and interest in future participation. Responses are almost completely positive, with only the wish that more children could be served.

Assistance League also conducts an annual survey of its members about their satisfaction with all of its philanthropic programs. Input provides valuable insight into how well the operation works, the ease with which members can do their "jobs," and their level of interest in continuing to work on Togs For Tots and other programs.

#### Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

Assistance League has operated Togs For Tots since 1988. Because of ever-increasing economic need in our community, Assistance League will continue this program indefinitely. Financial support will come from community generosity (grants and donations), proceeds from the operation of Assistance League's resale shop, and fundraisers. To insure that Togs For Tots will be managed efficiently and economically, Assistance League volunteers are committed to serving in all aspects of the program, including the careful and frugal purchasing of Togs For Tots clothing and supplies.
