Program / Project Description:						

In the five years since its founding, RISE Therapeutic Equestrian Center has transformed the lives of children in our community with special needs. RISE is a nonprofit organization that exists to "Reach Inside Souls using Equines". Our mission is to provide equine assisted activities and therapies for individuals with cognitive, physical, or emotional challenges in order to help them meet personal goals, maximize activities of daily living, and improve overall function while experiencing the joy of horsemanship. RISE currently serves approximately 45 clients a week, year round, divided between two different programs. Our adaptive riding program, through the Equestrian Center, focuses on life skills through riding lessons and horsemanship. Our outpatient therapy clinic, RISE Rehabilitation, incorporates equine movement, also known as hippotherapy, into a comprehensive treatment plan which uses purposeful manipulation of equine movement to engage sensory, neuromotor, and cognitive systems to achieve functional outcomes.

A priority need for RISE Therapeutic Equestrian Center is funding for a tractor. Our horses are the foundation of our programs and need optimal conditions of our grounds and arena. They pull together our team of caring and dedicated volunteers and professionals that offer their time and expertise to help reach inside the souls of our riders. A tractor would allow our staff and volunteers to remove manure from our horse paddocks and arena in an efficient and responsible manner, giving our horses a clean and safe environment to both live and work. We would also be able to turn the manure, allowing for the composting process, and use said compost to improve areas on our grounds. A tractor would also allow us to remove excess manure from the property as needed and requested. We have had many requests from our community for manure for composting. A tractor would give us the opportunity to load excess manure into community member's vehicles. Finally, we would use the tractor for arena maintenance. The tractor would be used to grade the special arena dirt to keep it even and to keep it from hardening.

RISE Therapeutic Equestrian Center is respectfully requesting your consideration of a grant of \$10,000 from The Najim Charitable Foundation to fund a tractor. This would practically support our adaptive riding program and therapy clinic that make such a meaningful difference in the lives of the children we serve. A contribution from your foundation will ensure our horses' living and working areas are well-maintained, allowing our horses to continue to provide riding sessions to our riders.

The movement of a horse provides three dimensional input to the rider's pelvis that replicates the movement of our walking. Thirty minutes of equine movement is equivalent to 2,500 steps of normal walking for a child with special needs. This is not only enjoyable and life changing for the child, but it is also a highly effective method of providing modulated sensory input to the brain.

We confidently believe our programs are consistent with the mission of The Najim Charitable Foundation. We hope you will find it in your hearts and budget to support our programs.

Evaluation Plan:

-By using a tractor, we will see an expedited, efficient, and effective method of ground maintenance while being able to provide the community with compost.

-We will decrease the amount of labor needed by staff and volunteers regarding manure removal by 50%. -We will achieve optimal, clean living and working environments for all of our horses which will allow them to consistently provide riding sessions to our clients in more space. All trail ride areas that are currently filled with manure will be removed or properly composted.

Plans to sustain project beyond the term of this request:

Our tractor will be used daily. The tractor will also receive daily routine maintenance, followed by the maintenance schedule recommended by the manufacturer. Most manufacturers provide a schedule of maintenance by hours of use, followed by annual maintenance. Only trained, experienced staff will operator the tractor on the property in order to ensure safety and proper use.
